Look at me

And tell me if you have known me before

With her project Look At Me And Tell Me If You Have Known Me Before, Los Angeles-based Dutch photographer Monica Nouwens dedicated herself to portraying the ambivalent appeal of one of the world's largest cities. For Look at me ... she focuses on underground youth, LA bohemia so to speak, a subculture of people who seem to have withdrawn from the dominant consumer culture, shaping a more personal, small-scale alternative.

Nouwens' photos and videos can be seen as collaborations with these individuals, depicting their get-togethers, activities and parties, sharing their social dreams. Her images of this community living in a post-Bush America in turmoil show the need for a poetic alternative. Nouwens' images are magical, mysterious, even sexy, all at the same time. Ultimately, her work condenses a mixture of roughness, sensuality and ephemeral, emotional moments into a fragile but timeless image of beauty and the human condition.



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
